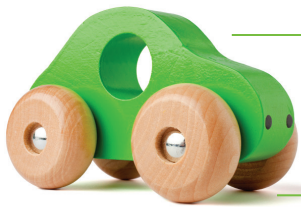




Kids in Cars

Riding in a car usually means you're going someplace fun, like the playground or your friend's house. But sometimes accidents happen, and kids can get hurt. Here are some tips to follow, so this doesn't happen to you.

- ★ Always wear a seat belt
- ★ Sit in a child's safety seat until your parent says you don't have to anymore.
- ★ Sit in the back seat until you're at least 13 years old.
- ★ Never open the door when a car is moving.
- ★ Do not get out of the car until the driver says it's safe from other cars.
- ★ Never walk behind a car that is running with the motor on, to be sure you can be seen



FOR PARENTS: Georgia State Child Occupant Protection Law Mandates

- ★ ALL children under the age of 8 whose height is less than 57 inches must ride in the backseat of a car. A child is safer in the back and farthest away from the force of an airbag. Remember that airbags are designed to save adults, and since they deploy with great force, they can be dangerous and fatal to children.
- ★ Children under the age of 8 are required to be in either a car seat or a booster seat suitable for their age and height.
- ★ If there is not a back seat in the vehicle (e.g., a truck) or if other restrained children are in the back seat, Georgia law permits a child under the age of 8 to sit in front if restrained in the proper car seat or booster and the child weighs at least 40 pounds.

Pink Eye



Pink eye, also known as "conjunctivitis" is caused by inflammation or an infection in the eye. It is called pink eye, because the white of the eye inside the eyelids becomes red or pink. You can experience drainage, itching or pain if you have pink eye. Anyone of any age can get it, and because it is caused by an infection, it is highly contagious, and therefore, be spread to others very easily.

If your eyes seem itchy, red or crusty in the morning, you should tell a parent. Don't wait because it can spread very easily to others in your home or at school, and it must be treated early. Your parent should take you to a doctor to have it examined and treated.



Doctors treat the eye infection with drops and recommend warm washcloth or paper towel soaks. Most kids have to stay home from school until the eye infection clears up. This can take 3-5 days.

The best way to avoid spreading the infection to others is to wash your hands often. Any time your hands touch your hair or your face, the infection can get on your hands and be spread onto desks, tv remotes, computer devices, books, etc., so wash your hands often. Your friends, family, and teachers will appreciate it.
